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MAJOR DECISIONS OF COUNCIL

(June, 2019 - March, 2022)

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The Council of the University during the period under review (June, 2019 to March, 2022) held a number of Meetings. The following major policy decisions which were taken are published for the information of the University Community.

A. 254TH MEETING (19TH JUNE, 2019)

Commencement of the KNUST Obuasi Campus

Council approved the commencement of the KNUST Obuasi Campus during the 2019/2020 Academic Year with the following programmes;

- i. BSc Electrical and Electronic Engineering
- ii. BSc Civil Engineering
- iii. BSc Geomatic Engineering
- iv. BSc Metallurgical Engineering
- v. BSc Geological Engineering
- vi. BSc Construction and Technology Management
- vii. BSc Environmental Science
- viii.BSc Business Administration (Logistics and Supply Chain Management)
- ix. Master of Business Administration (MBA)

A Coordinating Dean and Coordinating Registrar were appointed to oversee the administration of the Campus. Academic Work for the Campus commenced in September, 2019.

B. 261ST MEETING (19TH DECEMBER, 2020)

Establishment of KNUST Bottling Limited Company

As part of efforts to diversify the investment portfolio of the Ghana Universities Staff Superannuation Scheme (GUSSS), Council approved a Joint Venture Agreement (JVA) between KNUST and GUSSS for the production of water for the University Community and its environs. The sharing ratio of the JVA is 40:60 for KNUST and GUSSS, respectively.

C. 263RD MEETING (19TH MARCH, 2021)

C1. Restructuring of the University Information Technology Services (UITS)

Council approved the recommendations of the Academic Board for the restructuring of the University Information Technology Services (UITS) into a Directorate, effective, 1st January, 2022:

- i. The UITS is to be headed by a Director, appointed in accordance with Schedule J of the University Statutes.
- ii. The UITS has five (5) Divisions, to be headed by Deputy Directors.

 The Divisions are:
 - Network Operations and Infrastructure;
 - Software Development;
 - · Systems and Data Management;
 - · User Support Services; and,
 - · Information Security and Technology Assurance

C2. Establishment of E-Learning Centre

Council considered and approved the establishment of an E-Learning Centre in the University. The Centre, among others, is to:

- i. Support both synchronous and asynchronous teaching and learning;
- ii. Facilitate online learning support/interaction;
- iii. Promote digital literacy training;
- iv. Promote learner-centred teaching and use of e-pedagogies;
- v. Provide support for online Assessment;
- vi. Provide support in a systematic, coherent and appropriate way to meet the needs of learners; and,
- vii. Provide human-centred online learning environment

The E-Learning Centre is to be headed by a Director at the level of a Faculty Dean. The Centre has a Board comprising the following:

- · Chairman (appointed by the Vice-Chancellor)
- · University Librarian
- · Director of IDL
- Director of UITS
- · Director of E-Learning
- Dean of Students
- · Head of QAPU
- Dean, Faculty of Educational Studies
- · One Representative from each College
- SRC Representative

D. 267TH MEETING (16TH DECEMBER, 2021)

Elevation of the Quality Assurance and Planning Unit to Quality Assurance and Planning Office

Council approved the elevation of the Quality Assurance and Planning Unit into a Faculty status and renamed as Quality Assurance and Planning Office, effective 1st January, 2022.

The Office is to be headed by an Academic Staff not below the rank of an Associate Professor.

The Quality Assurance and Planning Office has five (5) Departments, namely:

- i. Quality Assurance, E-Learning and Accreditation Department;
- ii. Planning Department;
 - iii. Monitoring and Evaluation Department;
 - iv. Management Information Systems Department; and,
 - v. Examinations Audit Department

E. 268TH MEETING (31ST MARCH, 2022)

E1. Elevation of the Office of the Dean of Students

- Council, on the recommendation of the Academic Board, has elevated the Office of the Dean of Students into Directorate of Students Affairs, effective, 1st April, 2022.
- ii. The Dean of Students is to be re-designated as Director of Students Affairs and to be placed at a level, equivalent to a Provost of a College.
- iii. The Director of Students Affairs is to be assisted by two (2) Deputy Directors who are to be placed at the level of a Dean of a Faculty.
- iv. The Deputy Directors are to be responsible for:
 - a. Students' Housing and Welfare
 - b. Students' Conduct and Discipline
- v. The Director and the two (2) Deputies are to be appointed by Council on the recommendations of the Vice-Chancellor.
- vi. The Director of Students Affairs will serve a term of three (3) years in the first instance, renewable for another term of three (3) years only, while the Deputy Directors will have a term of two (2) years, renewable for another term of two (2) years only.

E2. Administrative Committee

Council agreed that the Administrative Committee should not be considered as a statutory Committee of Council.

Council consequently directed that, Section 3.3 of Recorder No. 337, September 2010, Vol. 44, No. 4 which states that the Administration Committee is a Statutory Committee of Council should be **EXPUNGED** from the Records and the University Community informed accordingly.

E3. Elevation of the School of Graduate Studies

 Council, on the recommendation of the Academic Board, has elevated the School of Graduate Studies to a Directorate with effect from 1st April, 2022.

- ii. The Dean of School of Graduate Studies is to be re-designated as Director of School of Graduate Studies and to be placed at the level, equivalent to a Provost of a College.
- iii. The appointment of the Director shall be in accordance with Schedule K of the University Statutes.
 - iv. The Director of School of Graduate Studies is to be assisted by a Deputy Director who would be at the level of a Faculty Dean.
 - v. The Director will serve a term of three (3) years in the first instance, renewable for another term of three (3) years only, while the Deputy Director will have a term of two (2) years, renewable for another term of two (2) years only.

E4. Elevation of the Students Accounts Section to a Division

Council, on the recommendation of the Academic Board, has elevated the Students Accounts Section of the Finance Office to a Division, effective, 1st April, 2022. The Division is to be headed by a Deputy Finance Officer.

E5. Establishment of Senior Member Positions in the Registrar's Offices and Estate Organisation

Council established additional Senior Member Positions in the Registrar's Offices and Estate Organisation as follows:

Registrar's Offices

- i. Examinations Office
- ii. Affiliations Office
- iii. KNUST Obuasi Campus

Estate Organisation

Land Administration and Management

E6. Upgrade of Meteorology and Climate Science Unit to Department

Council approved the elevation of the Meteorology and Climate Science Unit of the Department of Physics into a Departmental status, effective, 2022 Academic Year.

E7. Establishment of Centre for Educational Research and Development (CERD)

Council established the Centre for Educational Research and Development (CERD) under the Faculty of Educational Studies, effective, 2022 Academic Year.

The Centre, among others, is to:

- Conduct cutting edge research with grants that would influence educational policy and practice by collaborating with international and local educational agencies and institutions;
- ii. Build capacity of teaching and non-teaching staff on educational practices and policies;
- iii. Support the development and review of curriculum; and,
- iv. Seek for grants.

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
