GRADING OF STUDENT PROJECT WORK

INTRODUCTION

A framework for the grading of students Project work as approved by the Academic Board at its 324th (Regular) meeting is published for the information of the University community.

GUIDING PRINCIPLES

i. Students who are not able to meet deadline for submission of their projects at the end of the second semester should be graded for work done so far.

- ii. In the event that a student fails to meet the submission deadline, he/she should lose some marks.
- iii. A student's inability to submit the final report should attract an "I" (Incomplete).
- iv. Inability to reach midway of project work should attract an "F" (Fail).

v. For ease of calculating the credit hours, each semester's assessment should be graded over 100% while students who delay should be given a deadline to submit.

PROJECT DURATION

Students are allowed to do their project work in two semesters. In this case, students are expected to present their project topic for approval at the end of the second semester of the third year.

However, Departments which prefer to maintain one-semester project duration, should do so, but must use the first and second semester components of the framework.

PASS MARK

A student trails the course if:

i. at the end of the deadline for submission of the project work he/she had not been able to present data analysis and results,

ii. he/she completes the project work but does not obtain at least 40%.

iii. he/she is unable to submit the final report of his/her project.

FRAMEWORK FOR SCORING

The framework takes into consideration two types of projects i.e. Projects with oral presentation (Semester 1 and Semester 2, scenario II) and those without oral presentation (Semester I and Semester 2, scenario I).
