ABOUT KNUST

The Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology (KNUST), Kumasi is the foremost Science and Technology University in the country. It has, within the period of its existence, become an important Centre for the training of scientists and technologists not only for Ghana but also for Africa and other countries.

The University campus lies to the east of Kumasi, the Ashanti Regional capital.

There are six (6) halls of residence and other hostel facilities on campus. The halls are Queen Elizabeth II Hall, Independence Hall, Republic Hall, Unity Hall, University Hall and Africa Hall. The hostels on campus either belong to the University or Associations/Unions of the University. Some of these are SRC Hostel. Tek Credit Union Hostel. GRASAG Hostel, GUSSS Hostels, etc.

The University also has a number of municipal facilities. These include a Hospital, Basic Schools (i.e. Nursery, Primary and Junior High School), Maintenance Department, Estate Organisation, Transport Department, Photocopy Unit, Printing Press, Sports Complex (GUSSS Sports Complex), a Bookshop, a Shopping Mall, Staff Clubs/Canteen, Sports Stadium (Paa Joe Stadium), Gymnasium,

an Olympic size Swimming Pool, Commercial and Banking Facilities, Post Office, Places of Worship and Guest Houses.

To build on KNUST's leadership as the premier science and technology university in Ghana and to be among the top ten universities in Africa.

By a Government Ordinance of October 6, 1951, the Kumasi College of Technology was established as a public University with the Faculty of Engineering and affiliated to the University of London. It began operations on January 22, 1952, with 200 teacher training students who were relocated from Achimota College to form the nucleus of the Kumasi College of Technology. The College expanded enormously

in academic disciplines and infrastructure in the years that followed. In addition to the Faculty of Engineering, the Departments of Pharmacy and Agriculture were established in 1953, followed by the Departments of General Studies, Town Planning & Building, and the Faculty of Science.

As the College developed, it was decided that its Science and Technology status be maintained. To this end, the Teacher Training Section, excluding the Art School, was transferred to the Winneba Training College and the Commerce Department to Achimota, in January 1958.

In 1961, the Kumasi College of Technology was granted full-fledged university status based on the report of a commission appointed by government to advise it on the status of the College. Consequently, the Kumasi College of Technology was converted into an autonomous University by an Act of Parliament on August 22, 1961 and named, The Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology (KNUST). KNUST was formally inaugurated on Wednesday, November 29, 1961. The University began awarding its own degrees in lune, 1964.

After the overthrow of Dr. Kwame Nkrumah, the name of the University was changed to the University of Science and Technology (UST), Kumasi on February 24, 1966 by a decree. By an Act of Parliament, 1998, Act 555, the name of the

University, reverted to its original name as Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology.

The University has expanded and undergone major changes, especially in its academic structure since 1965. In January 2005, the University adopted the Collegiate System to allow for greater academic and administrative autonomy. Under this System, the various Faculties were condensed into six Colleges, namely;

- College of Agriculture and Natural Resources (CANR)
- College of Architecture and Planning (CAP)
- · College of Art and Social Sciences (CASS)
- College of Engineering (CoE)
- · College of Health Sciences (CHS) and
- · College of Science (CoS)

At the beginning of the 2015/2016 Academic Year, the Colleges were restructured by the merger of the Faculty of Art with the College of Architecture and Planning resulting in the new College of Art and Built Environment. The Colleges of the University now stand as:

- College of Agriculture and Natural Resources (CANR)
- College of Art and Built Environment (CABE)
- College of Engineering (CoE)
- · College of Health Sciences (CHS)

- College of Humanities and Social Sciences (CoHSS)
- College of Science (CoS)

As a way of expanding access to tertiary education, the University in 2005, established the Institute of Distance Learning (IDL) under the Faculty of Science with two learning centres in Accra and Kumasi. The IDL has now been elevated to the status of a College with the appointment of a Director to oversee its operations. It now has learning centres in twelve of Ghana's sixteen regions and aims at bringing the quality and demand-driven tertiary education offered by KNUST to the doorstep of all, especially, the working class.

In the 2019/2020 Academic Year, the University established a satellite campus in Obuasi with selected programmes in Engineering, Environmental Science and Supply Chain Management.

Deans of Faculties report directly to the Provosts of Colleges whereas the Heads of Departments report to the Deans of Faculties.

The Academic Board of the University formulates and carries out the academic policy of the University and regulates and approves programmes of study and examinations held in the University.

ADMISSION PROCEDURES

Undergraduate Admission Requirements

Admission to KNUST is strictly based on merit. Limited vacancies are therefore keenly competed for.

There are five categories of applicants for the undergraduate programmes as follows:

- · West Africa Senior High School Certificate Examination (WASSCE)/ Senior Secondary School Certificate Examination (SSSCE) holders;
- General Certificate Examination (GCE) Advanced Level holders:
- International Baccalaureate (IB) holders:
- General Business Certificate Examination (GBCE) holders;
- Advance Business Certificate Examination (ABCE) holders;
- Matured Applicants (age: 25 years and above) including HND holders (with 3 years working experience); and,
- · Other Foreign qualifications.

Online Application E-Vouchers are available between April and October and are obtainable from all Regional Ghana Post Offices throughout Ghana.

Programme Duration

Undergraduate programmes are of four (4) years duration, except Human Biology, Doctor of Pharmacy, Bachelor of Dental Surgery, Doctor of Veterinary Medicine and Doctor of Optometry, which are of six (6) years.

University Library System

The KNUST library system, comprising the Main Prempeh II Library, six College Libraries and Basic School libraries, serve as the knowledge hub of the University. It plays a central role of supporting the noble vision of the University, through the provision of state-of-the-art library services that support teaching, learning and research in the University. - Build the capacity of staff and students through tailor-made training programmes in Information and Digital literacy;
- Help connect students and staff to the global knowledge eco-system;
- Enhance learning journey, supported by cutting-edge learning technologies;
- Inspire users to fulfill their future dream of contributing positively to the development of Ghana and the world at large.

Collection

The total book stock of the entire library system is **228.968** volumes.

Journal Subscription

The library maintains collaboration with the Consortium of Academic and Research Libraries in Ghana (CARLIGH), and the Electronic Information

for Libraries (Eifl.Net) to facilitate access to over 40.000 electronic journals from about 61 academic databases. This digital access comprises more than 100 million full text documents, bibliographic information, abstracts and book reviews.

F-books
