In total, Seventy-Six Thousand, One Hundred and Twenty-One (76,121) applicants applied for admission this year. We have so far registered Twenty-Five Thousand, Nine Hundred and Eighty-One (25,981) Undergraduate and Postgraduate students; made up of males 14,479 (55.73%) and 11,502 females (44.27%).

Our initiative to champion Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) education for girls is really on course and we are determined to improve upon it as an institution.
