agenda, our Colleges have held their graduation ceremonies from the 20<sup>th</sup> to 29<sup>th</sup> November 2024.

Before I proceed, I would like to express my personal gratitude and deepest appreciation to Nana Chancellor and the University Council both past and present for the massive support I received during my first tenure in office, from August 2020 to July 2024 and for the opportunity of renewal for a further term of two years to serve our Great University, a University that I love so much, the University that trained and developed me to be who I am today. Nana Chancellor, I am truly and honestly grateful to you for this wonderful privilege to serve KNUST, Asanteman and our dear country.

Let me also use this platform to acknowledge our staff and students for the diverse roles they have played in working so hard to bring the academic year to a peaceful and successful end.

Distinguished ladies and gentlemen, let me now take you through the activities of the University during the period under review.

#### 2.0 STATISTICS ON GRADUATING CLASS

Distinguished ladies and gentlemen, this morning's session climaxes the 58<sup>th</sup> Congregation which commenced on Wednesday, 20<sup>th</sup> November 2024. We have already held fifteen (15) sessions for the six (6) Colleges of the University and the Institute of Distance Learning (IDL). The total number of graduating students for the 58<sup>th</sup> Congregation is nineteen thousand, two hundred and fifty-four (19,254). Out of this number, seventeen thousand and twenty-nine (17,029) are undergraduates and two thousand, two hundred and twenty-eight (2,228) are postgraduates. This morning, we will be graduating five hundred and seventy-five (575) postgraduate students. One hundred and sixty-five (165) will be receiving PhD degrees out of which fifty-three (53) (33.1%) are females.

Nana Chancellor, I am also elated to announce the **OVERALL BEST GRADUATING STUDENT** and **BEST GRADUATING FEMALE** undergraduate student of the University for this 58<sup>th</sup> Congregation. They are, Isaac Oniti Jesutofunmi, Department of Computer Engineering, with a Cumulative Weighted Average (CWA) of 87.23, and Naa Akweley Marley, Department of Sociology and Social Work, with a CWA of 83.89. Ayekoo to both of them.

#### 3.0 PUBLIC LECTURES

Nana Chancellor, for the period under review, three (3) Professorial Inaugural Lectures have been held.

Professor Atinuke Adebanji of the Department of Statistics and Actuarial Science delivered on the topic "Facts from Artefacts: A Journey in Statistical Inquisition".

Prof. Kwabena Nyarko Biritwum, Provost, College of Engineering focused on "Universal Access to water and Sanitation Services. A Myth or a Reality".

Prof. Alexander Yaw Debrah, Dean of the Faculty of Allied Health lectured on "Eliminating Filarial Diseases: New Hope for an Old Battle".

### 4.0 20<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATIONS OF THE INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMMES OFFICE

Distinguished Ladies and Gentlemen, Our International Programmes Office (IPO) marked its 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary in August 2024 under the theme "20 years of Internationalisation and Impact: The Next steps". The celebration was marked with focused discussions on improving our internationalisation agenda and enhancing support and opportunities for both our international staff and students.

#### 5.0 KNUST E-LEARNING WEEK AND CONFERENCE

Nana Chancellor, the KNUST E-Learning Centre organised the 2<sup>nd</sup> edition of the E-Learning Week and International Conference from 8<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> July 2024 under the theme "Fostering Excellence in E-Learning across Diverse Disciplines: Progress, Challenges and Prospects". The Conference featured thought-provoking keynote speeches, interactive workshops, and panel discussions addressing the challenges and opportunities of the evolving digital education landscape.

#### 6.0 CELEBRATING FACULTY AT THE GLOBAL FRONT

Nana Chancellor, our staff are excelling on the national and international fronts. I am excited to report that;

Professor Reginald Adjetey Annan, Department of Biochemistry and Biotechnology is going down in history to be the first ever Principal Investigator in Africa to win the World Cancer Research Grant to work on breast cancer among sub-Saharan women.

Professor Philip Antwi-Agyei, Director, Office of Grants and Research has also been appointed to join the High-level United Nations Panel of Experts for the Resilient Food Systems Reports.

Professor Alexander Yaw Debrah and Dr. Linda Debrah represented Ghana at the 2024 United Nations General Assembly Science Summit, where they

made presentations on management of lymphatic filariasis and Conducting Clinical Research in Ghana.

Dr. Ralph Nyadu Addo, Department of Publishing Studies, and Dr. Yesuenyeagbe Fiagbe, Department of Mechanical Engineering also picked up international awards in Germany for promoting Ghana-German cooperation through the African Centre for Career Enhancement and Skills Support (ACCESS) Project and an award for Kente Weaver prototype machine. We say Ayekoo to them and all other staff who continue to make us proud out there.

#### 7.0 STUDENT ENTREPRENEURSHIP AND AWARDS

Distinguished Ladies and Gentlemen, the entrepreneurship drive for our students to equip them to be employers remains paramount and our students continue to make us proud. At the 2024 Kosmos Innovation Centre Agritech Challenge, five KNUST Start-Ups swept a total of Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000) as seed funds, when thirty-five (35) business start-ups from ten (10) public universities qualified for the final assessment. McHan Cosmetics won the ultimate prize of Thirty-Five Thousand United States Dollars (\$35,000) for recycling cocoa pods into premium potash and soaps.

Tekcycle Ghana Limited won Twenty Thousand United States Dollars (\$20,000), Freshline Post Harvest Solutions also won Fifteen Thousand United States Dollars (\$15,000), BunnyBite Ghana Limited won Ten Thousand United States Dollars (\$10,000), and GanaFert had Ten Thousand United States Dollars (\$10,000). Congratulations to our hardworking students for continuing to fly high the flag of KNUST.

Nana Chancellor, our three-member student team were adjudged the 2024 Overall Gold Winners of the International Packaging Design Student Competition and also picked up three other awards from the World Packaging Organisation in Bangkok, Thailand. We say Ayekoo to the team.

Distinguished Ladies and gentlemen, management continues to celebrate our students who have achieved not only academic success but also leadership, creativity, ingenuity, innovativeness and a high sense of commitment to making a positive impact on society with their deep-seated curiosity, critical thinking skills and problem-solving acumen.

To this end, the second edition of the Vice-Chancellor's Students' Excellence Awards (VCSEA) that showcased our Students in Shining Armour was held under the theme: "Celebrating Achievements Beyond Boundaries: Recognising Students' Excellence."

The categories included Student Leadership, Academic Excellence, Innovation, Sports, Debate, Cadet, Peer Counselling, Entrepreneurship, Volunteering, Creative Arts and Outstanding Media Personality among others. Bringing the total award categories to fourteen (14). Out of the Two hundred and Twenty-Six (226) nominations received, fifty-two (52) students were recognised for outstanding achievements. Massive congratulations to all our students.

#### 8.0 KNUST RESEARCH FUND (KReF) AWARDS

Distinguished Ladies and gentlemen, our strategic mandate enjoins us as a University to undertake relevant and impactful research. This year, we have committed One Million, Five Hundred Thousand Ghana Cedis (GH¢1,500,000.00) to support Research for thirty-two (32) Staff. To enhance interdisciplinary and collaborative research, twenty-seven (27) of the awards were given under the multi-disciplinary category. We Congratulate all awardees and look forward to the impactful outcomes of their research.

### 9.0 GRADUATE STUDENTS' ASSOCIATION OF GHANA (GRASAG-KNUST) RESEARCH FUND (GReF)

Nana Chancellor, in the same spirit of supporting research and graduate studies, the Graduate Research Fund (GReF) has been established by the Graduate Students Association of KNUST. Fifty-one (51) postgraduate students have been awarded seed funds to support their research. Please join me to applaud Mr. Felix Kofi Adusei, the immediate past GRASAG-KNUST president, and his team for working so hard in making this vision a reality. Well done!

#### 10.0 GRANTS

Nana Chancellor, our faculty also competed for and won external grants. During the period under review, the University won a total grant of Ten Million, Six Hundred and Fifty-Two Thousand, Three Hundred and Ninety-Seven United States Dollars, Ten Cents (\$10,652,397.10.)

- Professor Robert Clement Abaidoo of the Department of Theoretical and Applied Biology won Four Million, Two Hundred and Thirty-One Thousand, Four Hundred and Sixteen Euros (€4,231,416.00) for the African Centre for Career Enhancement and Skills Support (ACCESS).
- 2. Professor Jerry John Kponyo won One Million, Four Hundred Thousand Canadian Dollars (\$ 1,400,000.00) to continue with the Responsible Artificial Intelligence Laboratory Project.

## 11.0 THE SUPPORT ONE NEEDY STUDENT WITH ONE LAPTOP (SONSOL) PROJECT

Nana Chancellor, KNUST remains committed to the all-inclusive education agenda of not leaving any student behind through the Support One Needy Student with One Laptop (SONSOL) Project. This year, through the benevolence of our sponsors, the University has been able to distribute Five Hundred and Three (503) laptops to students. This brings the total number of laptops distributed over the period to Two Thousand, Three Hundred and Two (2,302) with a monetary value of Twenty-Three Million Ghana Cedis (GH¢23,000,000.00).
